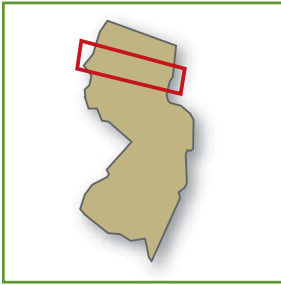

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

The Liberty-Water Gap Trail will meander past a multitude of New Jersey’s special places along its 156 miles of mixed rail-trail and hiking trails. The trail will lead you to 15 sites on the National Register of Historic Places, over 36 rivers and streams, and connect you to 46 national, state, county and municipal parks including America’s first county park—Branch Brook Park and the magnificent Statue of Liberty National Monument.

The Rails-to-Trails Conservancy staff has been working with the Liberty-Water Gap Trail Coordinating Committee and several counties on a number of initiatives. The first will be a four-year Public Awareness Project which will increase public use, awareness, and support for this cross-state trail by embarking on four major areas: public events, signage, Web site and printed material.
