Across the country, when trails connect to more destinations, businesses, jobs and communities, they can contribute more than \$138 BILLON annually to the US economy'.

In California, trails could generate as much as \$6.62 BILLON each year to the state's economy'.

Trail networks deliver considerable benefits to residents, businesses and the economy but **SUBSTANTIALLY MORE FUNDING** is needed to complete the Bay Area regional trail network.
