

Clawbacks Overview


February: USDOT freezes 3,200 federal grants

Review: consistent with Administration's priorities?

July: Congress rescinded Neighborhood Access and Equity grants

Nearly \$750 million in active transportation grants lost





Clawbacks Overview Continued


Summer through early Fall: most reviews complete

3 buckets:

- 1. Cleared to negotiate grant agreement
- 2. Elements rejected, otherwise cleared
- 3. Cancelled

Some trail, walking and biking grants remain in limbo
